Description of methodology (methods, tools & material used, etc)

Supportive supervision is a process of helping staff to improve their own work performance continuously. It is carried out in a respectful and non-authoritarian way with a focus on using supervisory visits as an opportunity to improve knowledge and skills of health staff.

therefore ISDP Malaria BCC project coordinator & senior Health Officer has been carryout support supervision in the field in Bari region, the support supervision visit takes 7 days from 23-29 March 2022.the supervision was covered Gardo, Dangorayo, Garowe and Armo districts

During Supervision:

During monitoring and supervision, we met with MCHs/PHC staff of districts and we explained them the aim of our visit and discussed how they support outreach staff smoothly implementing Malaria awareness to the community, they have shown that they are ready to work with malaria awareness on which they are working. all health facilities we visited have enough stock of RDT and ACT.

The continue to Assessment performances of Community Educators aspects of Malaria BCC routine activities and strategies for implementation.

60 mothers have been asking a question on malaria related for to assess their knowledge about this malaria disease, most of them showed they have basic knowledge for malaria treatment and prevention.

Community Educators:

During the supervision We met malaria outreach staff (Community Educators) in the areas we visited and briefed them on the malaria situation in Puntland. Community Educators were on duty, visiting homes to teach families how to prevent malaria. They doing Door to Door visit and short time meeting with mothers and giving malaria awareness when they are waiting health service in the health facility.

We also asked them about the challenges they face when they doing homes visit. they told us that they sometimes met pastoralize families who had migrated and moved after their livestock ran out due to the drought. they also pointed there is highly demands in community which we could not provide them. **COVID-19**:

It appears that in the community have become adapted to covid-19 and are not taking the basic steps to prevent it.

Constraints

Most of community remain demand livelihood intervention.

Recommendations

- The spring rainy season is expected to begin in April which could lead to an increase in malaria cases so there is a need to keep an eye on malaria cases in Puntland especially Bosaso.
- ISDP will continue and accelerate the Community Awareness on Malaria prevention and control and Diagnosis and treatment as well.
- to Encouraging community taking basic preventive measures of Covid-19.
