Description of methodology (methods, tools & material used, etc)

ISDP's Malaria program is to ensure by 2023, children under 5, male and female adults living in malarias areas have access to appropriate malaria prevention, diagnosis and treatment services decrease the number of Malaria effected people to 1 in 1000.

To ensure these objectives are accomplished ISDP is obliged to implement Malaria BCC activities cooperating with the ministry of health executing Community dialogue, Malaria Field-day, Door-to-door Malaria BCC lessons and Support & supervisions.

ISDP Malaria Project field coordinator and ISDP health supervisor carryout the implementing partner supervision activity at Burtinle, Harfo, Bacadweyn, Galkaio, Bur salah and Galdogob. districts and the field visit will take 5 days from 21-25 August 2023.

During supervision.

The ISDP team met with health workers in the areas they visited and explained the purpose of their visit by sharing the malaria situation in Puntland and how to encourage community early diagnosis, treatment, prevention and control. we also met with malaria educators in the areas they visited and listened to how activities going on, their outreach work and if there are any challenges they face during their outreach and home visits.

During field visit the supervisors met with Regional Health Officers of supervised location.

We are very grateful to all the staff of the health centres', the community mobilizers for the malaria we met during our field visit for quarterly supervision we met the community mobilizers for health program, we explained BCC activities that we are supervising now and how they as mobilizers take part to eliminate malaria our country.

The Supervisors have short meeting with community Educators and appreciated the outreach activity they are doing which is monthly basic and we encouraged to continue and accelerate especial upcoming rainy season because stagnant water during rain contribute malaria breeding sites which increasing mosquito population.

Supervision Findings.

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- Community Elders we meet during supervision demanding livelihood intervention at IDPs as do other organizations.
- Lack of motivation for community Educators.
- The RDTs and ACTs were available at all supervised Health facilities

Constraints

Lack of Motivation among Malaria Community Educators.
Low knowledge for mosquito larva source and how they manage in community level specially internal displaced people.

Recommendations

- community awareness on malaria Diagnosis, Treatment, prevention and control should be accelerating.
- Educating community for larva source and how they can manage.
